For my house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples

(Isaiah 56:7c)

If you ever drive east down 12th Avenue South towards UP you will see one of the iconic images of the University of Providence: the **steeple of Trinitas Chapel.** This steeple can be seen from all over campus and beyond. It is a quiet reminder of our constant call to prayer and to trust in God's providence.

In this year of Jubilee, known as a "Holy year", we are invited to be on pilgrimage. It is a special year of remission of sins and universal pardon. It is a time of spiritual renewal, pilgrimage, and reconciliation that occurs every 25 years. Pope Francis states "travel to Rome in order to experience the Holy Year and to all those others who, though unable to visit the City of the Apostles Peter and Paul, will celebrate it in their local Churches."

The vast majority of us will be doing the latter. It doesn't mean we cannot be on pilgrimage. We are still called to embrace the theme: Pilgrims of Hope. Right here on our campus each of us could build a moment into our day to make a pilgrimage to the chapel for a moment of prayer or come to one or more of the communal prayer opportunities offered throughout the week.

Let's us turn our thoughts today to Martin Luther King, and recognize that there are




ties between us, all men and women living on the earth, ties of hope and love, sister and brotherhood.




